She graduated from the Lovassy László High School in Veszprém in 1992. In 1999 she graduated in Szeged with a degree in mathematics and a degree in German language and literature, and in 2004 she received her PhD degree. In 2010 she habilitated in the field of the application of information and communication technologies in education. Since 2005, she has been a member, lecturer and then a core member of the Doctoral School of Education at the University of Szeged, and since 2007 she has been the head of the sub-program Information and Communication Technologies in Education. She currently has 5 defended and 7 active PhD students.

Her main scientific interests include technology-based assessment and evaluation; the development and improvement of thinking skills, the evaluation of quality of knowledge acquired in schools; and the application of information and communication technologies in education as a means to improve the quality of knowledge. Professional leader of the development of the eDia system applied in several countries around the world.

She has a wide range of national and international publications. Her scientific publications and studies number more than 100. The number of the independent references to her work is close to 700, her Hirsch index is 16.

She is a member and officer of several national and international scientific organisations. From 2005 to 2014 she was the chairman of the SZAB Working Committee on Educational Theory, from 2014 she was the chairman of the Specialised Committee on Educational Science and Psychology of the Academic Committee of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences in Szeged. She is the member of the editorial board of several Hungarian and international journals.
